



## **BANKING ON GREEN SITE LAUNCHED IN JAPANESE**

February 10, 2009 -- Deutsche Bank Group today announced the launch in Japanese of its global 'Banking on Green' website, focused on its commitment to the long-term sustainability of our ecological and social environments. As a global citizen, Deutsche Bank Group recognizes the responsibility it shares to battle climate change by optimizing its use of resources, while upholding its responsibilities to all stakeholders across all levels of its operations to uphold a healthy social environment.
